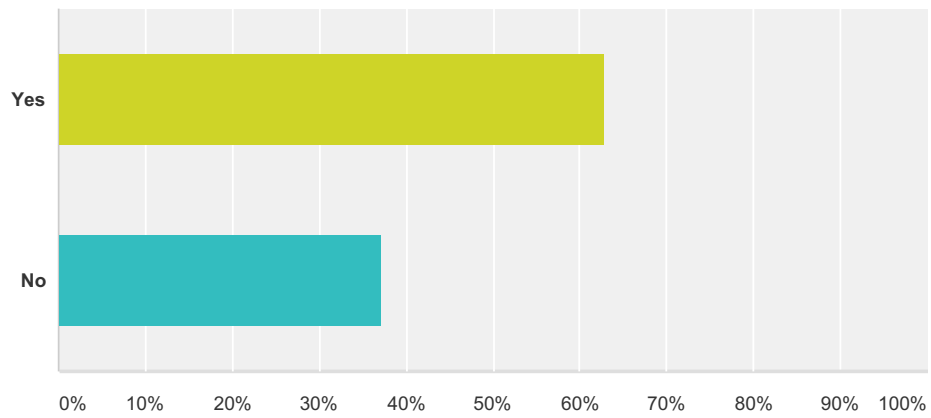


Q1 Do you have children enrolled or will you have children enrolled in the District?

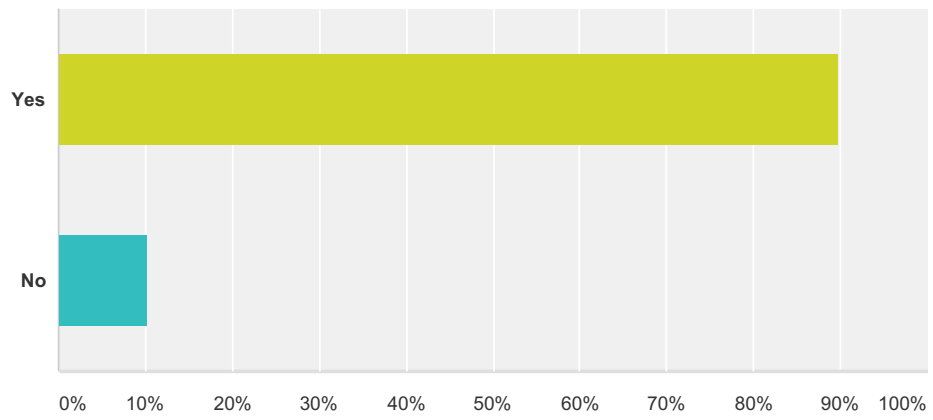

Q2 Are you a registered voter in the Coldwater Community School District?

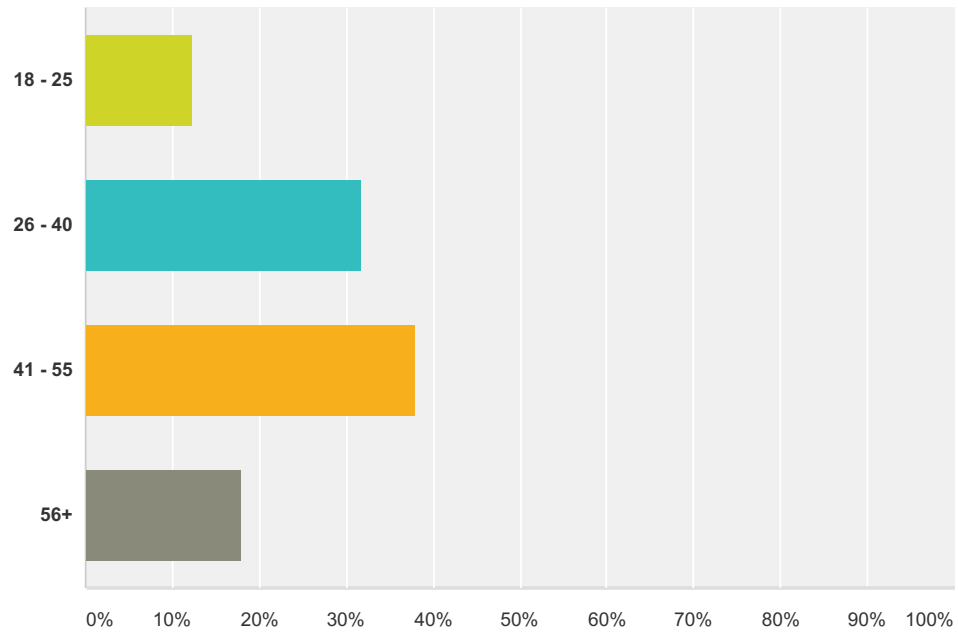

Q3 Please indicate your age group. If you are under 18, you cannot complete this survey.

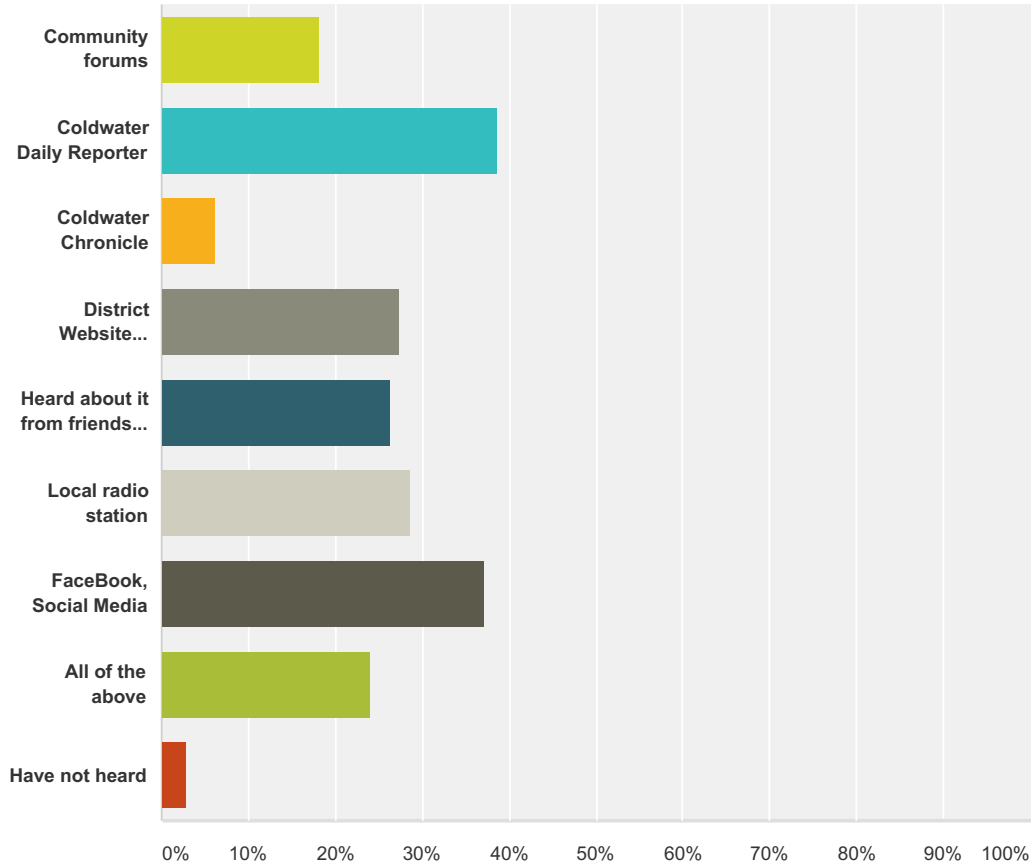

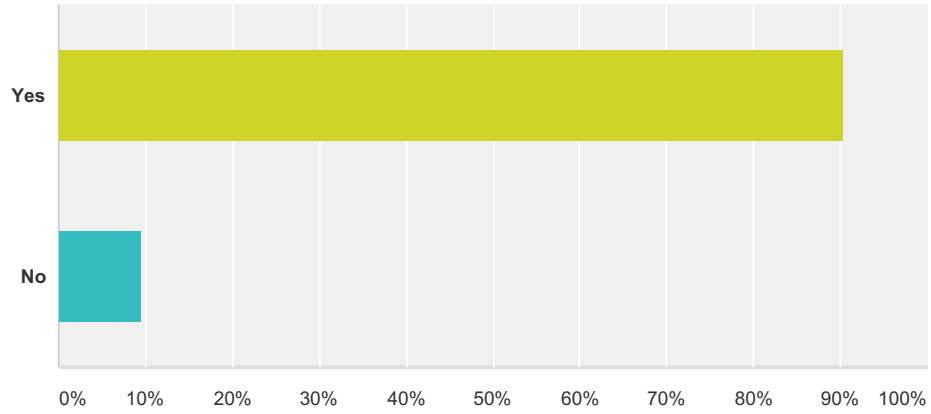

Q5 Do you believe the school district is in need of improvements to some / all of our facilities?

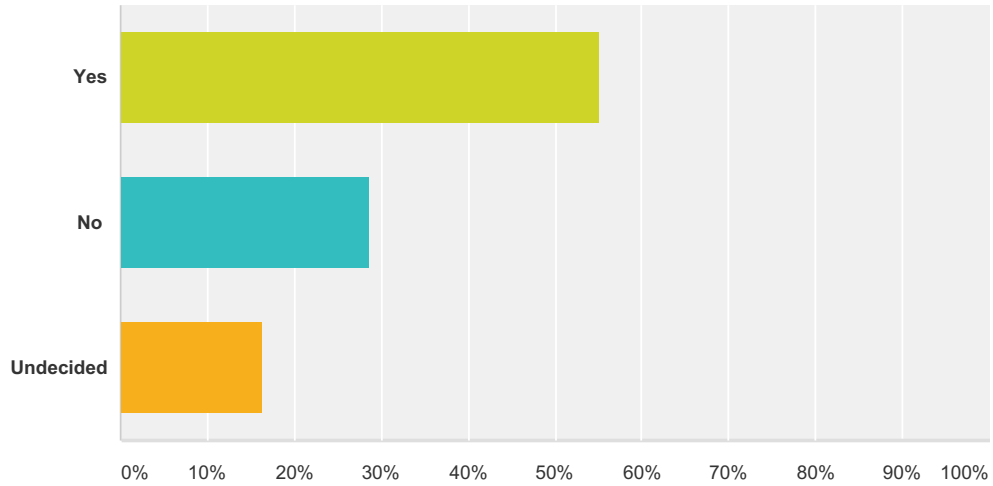

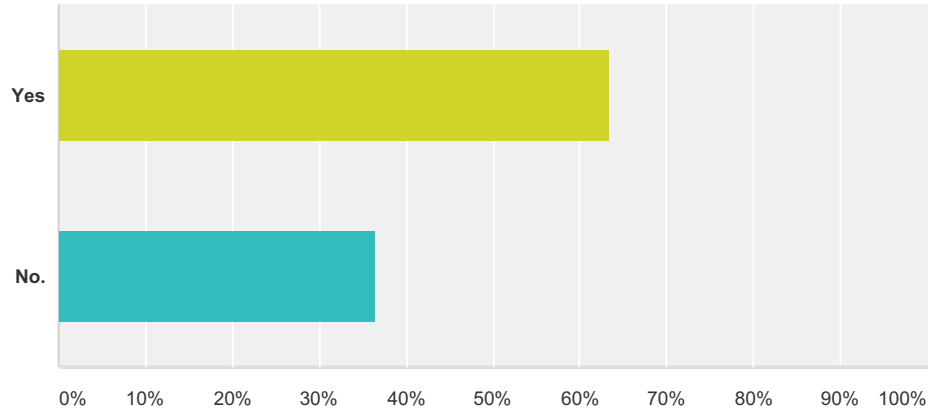
Q7 The total identified needs for long-term facility improvement would be \$40 million dollars. However, during the community forums, we were able to narrow our focus and prioritize these as our most critical needs: Build a new 4-5 building (including land acquisition) in the near vicinity of the Middle School and High School Mechanical replacements at Legg Middle School (plumbing, HVAC systems, electrical panels, etc) Selected roof replacement at Jefferson Elementary and Coldwater High School High School selective finishes (1954 building wing upgrades, ie locker rooms, student lockers, air handlers, doors, casework, etc) Additional and upgraded technology - district wide The budget for this bond proposal is \$29 million. An additional 1.39 mills would be needed in order to fund this work. The following chart is an example of how a 1.39 mill increase would affect homeowners on a monthly and yearly basis. Market Value Taxable Value

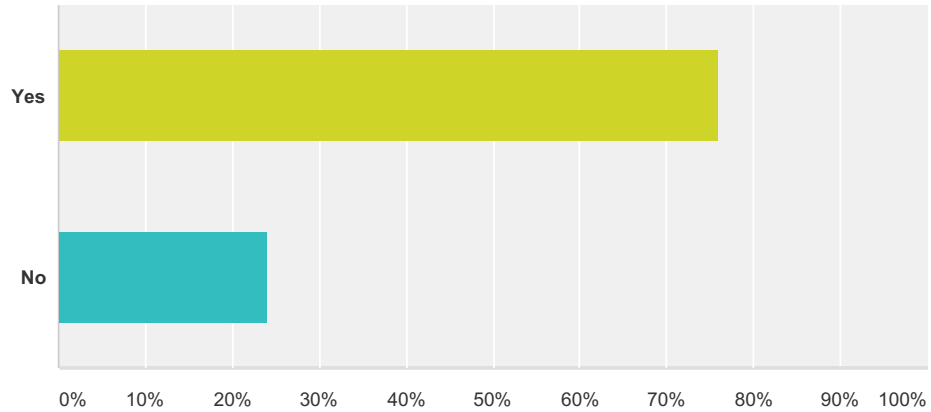
