Applying for scholarships is a wonderful opportunity that could potentially make paying for college a little easier. Scholarships ARE out there and ARE available to you both nationally and locally. We are very fortunate to have a community that values and believes in you, your future, and your success. We are infinitely thankful to be a part of a community who gives back so that you may leap forward.

Please be aware that being awarded a scholarship is highly competitive. You MUST stand out and be THE one who catches the donor's eye. PLEASE read the following recommendations and instructions in order to present the BEST, most desired application. The simplest things can disqualify your efforts. Those who pay attention to detail JUST MIGHT be the biggest winners in the end...Good luck!

ALL applications MUST be assembled, stapled, then submitted in this order for EACH scholarship:

1. Correct Cover Page
2. Completed Common Application (printed after completing the Branch County Community Foundation online application)
3. Transcript containing GPA and ACT Scores (2nd Semester Senior Year)
4. SAR (Student Aid Report, first page only from FAFSA)
5. Your Résumé (Maximum 2 pages)
6. Personal Statement / Personal Essay
7. Letter(s) of Recommendation
 - at least (1) one written letter no more than 6 mos. old
 - BCCF Recommendation Form (optional)
 - Any Additional Letter(s) of Recommendation (as required by the donor/scholarship description)
8. Additional / Specific criteria for individual scholarships (Additional information, additional essays, etc.)

Recommendations:

To be considered for any scholarship you must meet the criteria established for EACH individual scholarship.

Read each scholarship description thoroughly and carefully.

ONLY apply for the scholarship in which you qualify.

Fill out every section of the application.

Answer everything.

Leave no blanks.

Impress the donors. Use correct spelling and grammar.

Pay attention to detail.

Be sure to include ALL documentation - all of the additional materials - required by the donor as requested in the scholarship description.

Please be aware that Coldwater High School does not have the capacity to make copies of your scholarship applications.

The Coldwater High School Local Scholarship opportunities are divided into four (4) sections. Please read each section carefully and pay attention to any additional/specific criteria for each scholarship.

- MUST INCLUDE **ONE** correct CHS cover sheet (included in this packet) with **ONE HIGHLIGHT** for **EACH** scholarship for which you are applying, that is 3 scholarships = 3 separate cover sheets
- MUST INCLUDE **ONE** copy of application for each scholarship you are applying
- Be sure to include any additional requirements as described in the packet for the individual scholarships
- TURN IN to the GUIDANCE OFFICE to be collected and distributed to the donors by Mrs. Krzyzanski

- Required steps: Apply for Financial Aid (FAFSA), Provide transcripts with most recent GPA and ACT scores, Gather work history, volunteer work, and extracurricular activities, Secure a Recommendation Form and ask someone to fill it out for you, Update your Resume, Ask for a personal recommendation letter to have on hand, Be prepared to add additional attachments and essays as needed for specific scholarships.
- **CRITICAL**: You will not be considered if all criteria are not met and if the application is **INCOMPLETE or LATE**

- You will most likely **MAIL** these applications or submit them **ONLINE**.

Coldwater High School Scholarships

DUE: March 8, 2019 TO GUIDANCE OFFICE

1. *The American Legion Auxiliary Poppy Scholarship:

In 1975 the Coldwater American Legion Auxiliary inaugurated a scholarship to be awarded to the son or daughter of a veteran. Grandchildren MAY also qualify.

Eligible applicants must demonstrate:

- GPA – no minimum required
- The recipient must be a **graduating senior**, or a **graduate/alumni 25 years or younger**
- Community service, citizenship, and patriotism
- The desire to further his/her education
- Financial need

A selection committee of Auxiliary members will interview final candidates and make final decisions.

2. *Coldwater Early Bird Exchange Club Scholarship:

The Coldwater Early Bird Exchange Club will be awarding one or more scholarships each year, depending on available resources. The recipient may be either a Branch County **graduating senior** or a **student in attendance at a community college or 4-year University, or a vocational-technical institution planning to pursue a career in a child related area.**

Eligible applicants must demonstrate:

- GPA must be a minimum of 2.5
- A letter of recommendation from a teacher or employer
- A résumé stating your goals
- Financial need

Members of the Coldwater Early Bird Exchange Club will make selection.

3. Coldwater Noon Exchange Club:

The Coldwater Noon Exchange Club will award a scholarship to a **graduating senior** from Coldwater High School.

Eligible applicants must demonstrate:

- Must utilize the funds for his/her expenses for enrollment at **KCC**
- Must plan to attend a majority of classes at the Coldwater campus
- Have outstanding academic achievement, community service
- Must submit a brief **essay of approximately 250 words** explaining the reasons, which motivate the applicant to enroll at Kellogg Community College to pursue higher education following graduation from Coldwater High School
- Financial need

4. The Branch County Association of Realtors Scholarship:

The Branch County Association of Realtors will award a scholarship to a **graduating senior** from Branch County planning to enter the field of **Business, Sales, Marketing, or Advertising.**

Eligible applicants must demonstrate:

- A 2.5 GPA
- Financial need

5. The CHS Class of 1981 Scholarship:

The Coldwater High School Class of 1981 is offering an annual scholarship to a **graduating CHS senior**. Any senior class member is eligible to apply. This award is not necessarily dependent on any specific GPA nor based on need. All are encouraged to apply.

6. The Jillian Crist Memorial Scholarship:

Jillian Crist – a 2010 Coldwater graduate, a gymnastics tri-captain, cheerleader and aspiring neonatal nurse passed away due to an unfortunate auto accident November 19, 2011. With an outpouring of donations from family and friends, a scholarship has been established in Jillian's name to help those graduating seniors wishing to continue their education beyond high school. The family and a small committee will make the final selection. This scholarship may be renewable.

Eligible applicants must demonstrate:

- GPA 2.5 or higher
- Be a graduating CHS senior **OR** graduating from any Branch County Homeschool program
- Planning to attend a College or University in Michigan
- Entering the Health Science Field
- Have participated in high school athletics and/or extracurricular activities
- **Write a one page or more essay** on your **HERO**. Describe who your hero is and **WHY** in one page.
- Financial need is NOT a consideration

7. The C. L. Luce Memorial Scholarship Fund:

C. Lester Luce was the Coldwater High School Principal from 1968-1977. C. Lester Luce passed in 1980 and a memorial scholarship fund was established in his honor by the Luce family. This scholarship shall be open to a graduating Coldwater High School senior. The recipient shall be selected by the current Coldwater High School principal each year.

8. Coldwater Education Association (CEA) Scholarship:

(NOTE: Separate Application Required found in CHS Guidance Office) Applicants must also submit the common scholarship application along with the separate application as it contains the required transcript, test scores, and resume.

Eligible applicants must demonstrate:

- 3.0 GPA
- Strong academics, citizenship, and writing skills.
- 3 (three) letters of recommendation as outlined in application,
- **Personal Narrative Essay (however, this topic chosen for you by the scholarship committee and is found in the separate application)**

9. The CHS Alumni Scholarship:

The CHS Alumni Scholarship was established by the class of 1985 and is funded by donations of Coldwater High School Alumni. The recipient will be a graduating senior and is determined on a combination of scholarship and service to the school.

Eligible applicants must demonstrate:

- 3.2 GPA
- ACT composite of 22 or higher or SAT composite of 1020 or higher
- Student must participate in at least (3) three school based organizations
- Student must participate in volunteer experiences and document that involvement
- **1 additional essay (CHOOSE 1 Topic): A personal essay on leadership with specific examples of your student leadership OR applicants may submit a personal essay on character and how this individual exemplifies high standards of character**
- Statement of future goal
- Financial need is NOT necessarily a consideration in awarding of this scholarship

10. The Coldwater Rotary Club Scholarship:

The Coldwater Rotary Club offers scholarships to qualified graduates of Coldwater High School. Applicants should fill out the common application form and be willing to submit family income information to demonstrate need. This scholarship may be used for any form of higher learning, be it a four-year college, nurses' training school, or a two-year technical school. Main consideration will be given in the following order: ACT, GPA, strength of class schedule, extracurricular activities, and volunteerism.

11. The Coldwater Township Sunrise Rotary Scholarship:

The Rotary's motto is "Service Above Self". The Coldwater Township Sunrise Rotary has a history of supporting that motto by its support of numerous community activities most notably the Branch County Animal Shelter, The Naomi Davis Home, and the AYSO Creal Soccer Complex. The "Sunrise Rotary" makes this scholarship available to deserving graduates of Coldwater High School who plan to continue their education and best exemplify the Rotary motto of "Service Above Self". The funds for this scholarship must be used by the recipient for expenses in obtaining further education through a college, university, community college, or approved trade school.

Eligible applicants must demonstrate:

- GPA of 3.0 or above
- Be a graduating senior from Coldwater High School
- Have a documented history of service to the school and the community (submit a detailed list of activities)
- **In addition to the application, please submit a brief (maximum of one page) essay highlighting your commitment to the Rotary International Motto of "Service Above Self".**

The scholarship may not be renewed and must be used within 12 months of receiving the scholarship.

12. The E. Byron Thomas / Axner Olson Memorial Scholarship:

Mr. E. Byron Thomas was a former Coldwater High School Principal and Superintendent. Mr. Axner Olson was Legg Middle School Principal and Business Manager for Coldwater Community Schools. Both families have contributed funds to this scholarship and have requested the name of this scholarship never be changed. The recipient should be a needy, deserving, and worthy student who exhibits sincere desire to enter elementary or secondary education – meaning a career in the K-12 education system. It shall be given to **ONLY** a student demonstrating financial need. Selection shall be made by the family, or if need be, a committee composed of one person from each department at the secondary school.

13. The Jack Gates U of M Memorial Scholarship:

In 1983 the family and friends of Jack Gates inaugurated a scholarship to be awarded in his memory. The recipient must be a graduating senior who plans to attend the University of Michigan and has been accepted there. Selection of the recipient shall be by a member / relative of the Gates family and the high school counselor.

14. The John R. Vance U of M Memorial Fund:

John R. Vance, a 1975 graduate from Coldwater High School, and a 1979 graduate from the University of Michigan, passed away in 1982. A fund in his memory was established by his family and many friends. This award may be used by the recipient to offset matriculation fees, tuition, and other fees for entering and studying at the University of Michigan. Selection is to be made by the superintendent and the high school principal.

15. The Katie Weis Memorial Scholarship:

Katie Weis, age 9, was involved in a tragic accident in September of 2004. She was a very loveable, outgoing, social, and loyal friend to many. With donations from family and friends this scholarship was created in her memory.

Eligible applicants must demonstrate:

- GPA of 3.0 or better
- Be a graduating CHS senior
- Have participated in high school athletics and/or extracurricular activities
- Plan to attend a college or university in Michigan
- **In addition: Write a one page or more ESSAY** which highlights an experience from your own life and how it has influenced your development.

Financial need is **NOT** a requirement. This fund will continue to be open for anyone to contribute at any time.

Scholarship selection will be made by family members and may be presented to one, or more, recipients who qualify.

16. The Michigan Association of Retired School Personnel Scholarship:

The MARSP will be awarding a \$1,000 Scholarship to a **graduating senior** planning to enter the teaching profession. **Applications are to be completed by the student with attached recommendations as to capability and citizenship of the student from a high school teacher or the principal along with an attached record of grades.** The winner will be asked to attend MARSP's April meeting of MARSP with his/her parents for lunch, to be honored by the membership.

17. The Petzko Family Golf Scholarship:

The scholarship is offered by the Petzko Family in honor of Jennifer and Megan Petzko and their golf careers at CHS. The scholarship is available to a **graduating senior** who has participated in golf at the varsity level during his or her high school years at CHS. A **one-page essay** on **“How Golf Has Influenced Your Life”** is required with application.

18. The Pioneer State Mutual Insurance-Branch Insurance Merit Scholarship:

Available to a CHS Senior pursuing a 4 year degree in a **Business/Management related field.** Must have been accepted to an accredited college or university.

Eligible applicants must demonstrate:

- GPA 3.0 minimum
- Display a positive outlook, show compassion, be professional, courteous and approachable
- Good attendance and excellent oral/written communication skills
- Priority will be given to students involved in community and/or extracurricular activities
- Financial need will be taken into consideration

19. ASTRA Service Club Scholarship:

New in 2016, the ASTRA Service Club Scholarship will be offered to Senior ASTRA members. Please see any ASTRA advisor or CHS club member for an application.

20. (*)()The Clement Malovey Scholarship Trust (CB&T):**

Available to Branch County high school seniors and alumni.

22. (*)(**)Verbie E. Harkness Memorial Scholarship (CB&T):

Recipient must be a graduate of any high school in Branch County and a resident of Branch County. Scholarships are renewable and prior awardees will be given first consideration for renewal of the scholarship. No more than four awards per student. Award may be used for any type of higher education. Student must maintain a "B" average for preceding academic year. "Primary criterion for initial award shall be financial need, academic achievement and moral character."

TIP Grant The Tuition Incentive Program (TIP) provides eligible students tuition assistance for the first 2 years of college and beyond. NOTE: To be eligible, a student **MUST** have or have had Medicaid coverage for 24 months within a 36 consecutive month period between 6th grade and 12th grade **as identified by the DHS office.** **NOT ALL QUALIFY** for this opportunity, but if you think you meet the eligibility for the TIP grant call 1-888-447-2687 and ask if your name is on the list for TIP or you may also ask about this opportunity in the Guidance Office to verify through the State of Michigan online scholarship portal.

ProMedica Volunteer Scholarship Various \$1,000 scholarships are open to Branch County residents pursuing a career in a health related field. Complete applications are to be returned to the Volunteer Coordinator's Office at ProMedica (basement of the hospital) no later than 4pm on March 29, 2019. Applications are available in the Guidance Office in January 2019.
